e-Granthalaya is a Library Management Software which is very useful for computerization of library activities and user services. 


Fig.2: Visitors Statistics during 2013




Fig.3: Monthly Visitors

During 1994, an Inter Library Loan facility was added where registered users can search the books and then can generate/send online ILL request to the holding library.




Fig.5: Union Catalog of Indian libraries home page

National Informatics Centre (NIC) has developed a library automation software called e-Granthalaya and will be implementing this system in the colleges. The total budget for the project is INR 50 million (US\$ 802,000) and is to be borne by the State Government. While the software itself is free of cost, expenses will be incurred on manpower training and digitally cataloguing the library resources.

The software will help colleges catalogue their resources and will connect their libraries to a national network of libraries managed by NIC. This will allow students to conveniently access online databases, research reports, journals, textbooks, audios and videos across a various fields.

Vice-Chancellors of all universities run by the State Government have also jointly suggested the introduction of an upgraded security system based on Radio Frequency Identification Technology (RFID).

SCHOOLS TO DIGITISE LIBRARIES SOON

Making headway in the direction of modernisation of libraries, the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) has made it mandatory for all schools to digitise their libraries. In these digitised libraries, all the books, journals, reference books and all relevant material would be readily available to the students at the click of mouse.

To digitise libraries, the schools are using library automation software 'e-Granthalaya' which is developed by National Informatics Centre (NIC), Department of Electronics and Information Technology, Delhi. The software is developed by a team of library science and communications experts and software engineers.

Giving details of the scheme to digitise the libraries, SS Chauhan, deputy Director of KVS regional office, Dehradun told The Pioneer that all the books of the school library are provided a bar code printer which makes bar codes and with the help of bar code reader the librarian can trace the book. He said that all the 46 schools of the KVS of the region have accomplished this task.

H S Sharma, Principal of KV Birpur, Dehradun said that the library computer immediately tells the status of the book, whether it is in the library or it has been issued, the software also informs the librarians the exact location of book in the library and the inventory status.

DS Negi the Principal of KV, Oil and Natural Gas Commission, Dehradun told The Pioneer that with the help of this software the reading tendencies and the interest areas of the students could also be known. Esha Srivastava, librarian of KV Birpur said that the automation has made life easy for her as she can track the book in a matter of seconds; she said that her school has 8,376 books and all of them have been bar coded.



Unani medicines: CCRUM stresses on networking of information

A Unani medicine body has spelled out curability features of the Unani medicine while underlining the need for bridging 'gap between the user and information' to popularize the oldest mode of treatment public during a three-day workshop in capital.
