An NDMC spokesperson said, "With an aim to improve education to move ahead in the digital era, the NDMC has endeavored to provide digital libraries in its schools using the e-Granthalaya Integrated Library Management Software from National Informatics Centre (NIC), Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India."

Material available for free of cost

"Students can have access to over 68 lakh books on subjects like literature, mythology, science, research papers and academics free of cost," added the spokesperson.

He also said that the council now aims to digitise all its public libraries. While launching the service, Naidu said that the school library will not only promote building a knowledge driven community for the future but will also develop a road map for students.
