HED holds workshop on e-Granthalaya

Jammu, Jan 30: In continuation to ongoing innovative series of steps being taken by Dr. Asgar Hassan Samoon, IAS, Commissioner/Secretray to Govt. Higher Education Department, a one day workshop on e-Granthalaya an automated Web Based Library Management Software was organized at GGM Science College, Jammu today in collaboration with National Informatics Centre Jammu (NIC) for providing the best library automation solutions.

The workshop was conducted by a team comprising NIC officials including Ram Kumar Matoria (Technical Director, NIC HQ New Delhi) and Saleem Khan, Additional SIO, NIC Jammu Centre.

The Nodal Principal Dr. Ajeet Angral formally welcomed the team and emphasized the significance of Library Automation System in Govt. Colleges of Jammu Division, J&K.

The resource person R.K. version of E-Granthalya is 4.0 which is a Cloud Ready Application to facilitate web-based data entry with a Centralized Database. An interactive session was also conducted where the participants from the various colleges of the Jammu Division raised their queries and officials from NIC clarified their doubts.

The workshop was attended by Library Staff and Computer Science Faculty of approximately 25 Colleges of Jammu Division. Prof. Vinus Sharma, HoD Department of Computer Science of G.G.M. Science College, Jammu gave the brief note about the workshop. Formal vote of thanks was presented by Prof. Rahul Sharma of G.G.M. Science College, Jammu while the compering was done by the students of Computer Science Department.
